



### *Draft List:*

- **1. Bell's Brewery Two Hearted Ale** – (Kalamazoo, Michigan) Defined by its intense hop aroma and malt balance, hopped exclusively with the Centennial hop varietal from the Pacific Northwest lend their characteristic grapefruit and pine resin aromas. A significant malt body balances this hop presence; together with the signature fruity aromas of Bell's house yeast, leading to a remarkably drinkable IPA. 7.0% ABV – 60 IBU's.
- **2. Troegs Independent Brewing Co. Blizzard of Hops Winter IPA** – (Hershey, Pennsylvania) Troegs created this Winter IPA to toast hop growers around the world for another successful harvest. This storm of hoppy citrus and pine notes is a bright reminder that the end of the Hop Cycle is only the beginning. 6.4% ABV – 80 IBU's.
- **3. Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. Celebration Ale** – (Chico, California) First brewed in 1981, Celebration Ale is one of the earliest examples of an American-style IPA and one of the few hop-forward holiday beers. Famous for its intense citrus and pine aromas, Celebration is bold and intense, featuring Cascade, Centennial, and Chinook hops. 6.8% ABV – 65 IBU's.
- **4. Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. Pale Ale** – (Chico, California) Pale Ale began as a home brewer's dream, grew into an icon, and inspired countless brewers to follow a passion of their own. Its unique piney and grapefruit aromas from the use of whole-cone American hops have fascinated beer drinkers for decades and made this beer a classic, yet it remains new, complex and surprising to thousands of beer drinkers every day. 5.6% ABV – 38 IBU's.
- **5. Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. Hop Bullet Double IPA** – (Chico, California) Hops are the name of the game with a Double IPA, but the brewers knew they had to take it one step further. With Hop Bullet, they are using a new technique, hitting the beer with a double-barreled blast of Magnum hops and lupulin dust-pure, concentrated hop flavor-directly into the tank to emphasize the intense pine and citrus flavors of classic West Coast hops. 8.0% ABV -55 IBU's.
- **6. Great Lakes Brewing Co. Edmund Fitzgerald Porter** – (Cleveland, Ohio) Robust and complex, this porter is a bittersweet tribute to the legendary freighter's fallen crew. Packing a flavor of rich roasted barley and bittersweet chocolate notes. 6.0% ABV – 37 IBU's.
- **7. Antietam Brewery 1605 Irish Style Ale** – (Hagerstown, Maryland) An Irish-style Red Ale brewed with British malts and hops. Balanced and smooth, with subtle notes of caramel and a creamy, robust body. Every keg sold helps support IAFF Local 1605, Hagerstown. 5.0% ABV – 20 IBU's.
- **8. Samuel Adams Winter Lager** – (Boston, Massachusetts) German brewers were onto something centuries ago when they created rich bock beers for the winter. This version is spiced with cinnamon, ginger, and orange peel for a deep flavor and malty finish that will warm you on a cold winter's night. 5.6% ABV – 22 IBU's.
- **9. New Belgium Brewing Co. Fat Tire Belgian White Ale** – (Fort Collins, Colorado) Taking inspiration from decades of experience brewing Belgian beers, Fat Tire Belgian White is made with Seville oranges and Indian coriander, both freshly ground less than a mile from the Fort Collins brewery. It's a fresh, perfectly sweet, natural tasting Belgian White. 5.2% ABV – 12 IBU's.
- **10. Big Hill Ciderworks Standard Hard Cider** – (Gardners, Pennsylvania) Located just miles from here, and using the finest apples, Big Hill Standard sets the "standard" with a bright, fruit-forward flavor profile. No added sugars or flavors, just carefully selected apple varieties that are grown, pressed, and fermented on the Big Hill. 5.5% ABV – 5 IBU's.
- **11. Guinness Draught** – (Dublin, Ireland) Swirling clouds tumble as the storm begins to calm, settle, breathe in the moment, then break through the smooth, light head to the bittersweet reward. 4.2% ABV – 40 IBU's.
- **12. Miller Lite** – (Milwaukee, Wisconsin) Miller Lite is the great tasting, less filling beer that created the American light beer category in 1975. Triple-hops brewed for great pilsner taste! 4.2% ABV – 10 IBU's.
- **13. Yuengling Lager** – (Pottsville, Pennsylvania) A rich amber color and medium-bodied flavor with roasted caramel malt for a subtle sweetness and a combination of cluster and cascade hops. 4.4% ABV – 12 IBU's.

- **Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. Hazy Little Thing IPA** – (Chico, California) Home brewers can appreciate the privilege they have to sample beer straight from the tanks in all their raw glory. Some beers need a little polishing to get ready to go out into the world, while others – the hop-heavy, rowdy, crowd-pleasers-should just be left alone. The brewers at Sierra Nevada wanted to share this brewery-only treat with you, so we present this Hazy Little Thing, an unfiltered, unprocessed IPA, straight from the tanks to you. 6.7% ABV – 40 IBU's.
- **Bell's Brewery Christmas Ale** – (Kalamazoo, Michigan) A traditional Scotch Ale that is rich and malty with notes of caramel and a warm finish. Certain to make any occasion festive, or at least a bit more bearable. Enjoy with the company of friends and family! 7.5% ABV – 15 IBU's.
- **Troegs Independent Brewing Mad Elf** – (Hershey, Pennsylvania) The holidays at Troegs start with the infamous Mad Elf momentarily taking over the brew deck. So blame "him" for this cheerful ruby red creation reminiscent of ripened cherries, raw honey and cocoa with notes of cinnamon, clove, and allspice. 11.0% ABV – 15 IBU's.
